Discussion Guide for Zoom Groups

Dear Zoom Group Leaders – Thanks for taking the time to listen to this week’s teaching from Acts. I’m excited to have you digging into God’s Word this week. Start off with a moment to pray and ask the Holy Spirit to help you as you study together – and that each of you would have a personal application for the week ahead. – Pastor Angela

1) The Promised Gift

Ask someone in your group to read Luke 24:36-53. This passage gives the backstory for why we find the disciples in the upper room praying.

Question: What is the job of a “witness” (hint: think court-setting)?

Question: What is Jesus asking his followers to “testify” about (hint: vs 46-48)?

Read and compare Luke 24:49-50 with Acts 2:4-5.

Question: What is Jesus promising?

2) The Disciples are Baptized with the Holy Spirit

Read and compare Luke 3:15-17 and Acts 2:1-4.

When you read about this powerful moment, what stands out to you?

Do you feel called to respond personally?

3) Holy Spirit Baptism for ALL Believers

Pastor Angela shared a quote in her message. Read this to the group:

“[It’s for] all, in all ages, who believe on Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord and are children of Him. It’s intended to be the normal divine provision for a fully adequate Christian work and witness, available to all believers of all stations, all times, all races, and all callings.” (Van Cleave and Duffield, Foundations of Pentecostal Theology)

Why do you think Jesus wants to baptize us with the Holy Spirit?

What next steps of faith, do you feel called to take? (Water baptism? Asking God for HS baptism? What else?)

Finish your time with prayer. Offer to pray for people who may desire to be baptized with the Holy Spirit. Usually this is something we would do in person - laying hands on people and praying for them. Don’t be discouraged that we can’t do that today – just pray anyway and let’s see what God does.
