Q: What stood out to you?

The goal of our conversation today is to process personally this idea of living unique, and a personal calling.

Q: Molly gave a list of "things to keep in mind" when considering calling. What were they?

There are things we're all called to

Calling is not the same as occupational assignment

We see common themes emerge in our lives

A calling isn't the same things as an opportunity or a privilege

Callings move the kingdom forward

Callings are God growing something in us (naming and becoming)

Callings are given by God and special to you

Q: What are your thoughts on these? Any you can affirm personally, or any you disagree with?

Q: Molly share briefly the various ways the term "calling" is used in the Bible. When you personally considered the question, "what is your calling?" what comes to mind?

Calling: a unique role or task in someone's life



Questions to consider:

What are you good at?

What are you not good at?

What are you passionate about?

What do you find the most satisfaction in doing?

Q: When you reflect on your life, especially when you engage with others. what themes do you see emerge?

Read Philippians 1:3-6

Q: Molly mentioned that a calling is both who God made us to be, and who God's making us to be. Both who we are, and who we're becoming. What do you think about this?

Q: Where do you (or can you) see crossover between the things you enjoy doing, and engaging with others?

Q: Molly talked about the challenge of comparing ourselves to others. How has this been an issue for you, in embracing your own uniqueness?

Read 1 Corinthians 12:12-26

What do you hear Paul saying? How does this apply to our conversation today?

I think a successful conversation this week is for people to share the themes they see emerge in their own lives, and begin to process the idea that this might be a "calling" from God, and unique way they are called to live out God's mission in their own life, the unique role they play in God's greater work.
