



Series Week 11: Value of Community

This is our last week of the “Life on Mission” series. Throughout this series, we’ve processed the questions:

Who am I?

What am I doing?

What are we doing?

We’re finishing our series by processing together the value of community. We’re not meant to do life alone, but together! Even in this challenging season, we’ve got to find ways to be together, challenge each other and cheer one another on.

Q: What stood out to you?

Q: Seth made the statement, “In the triumphs and the defeats, a community can make all the difference.” What does he mean? How has being in community helped you during a success or challenge?

Q: Where has community been challenging for you, either in the past or in this unique, socially distanced season?

Q: Seth finished by saying, “Everyday you and I have so much potential to create everlasting change in each other’s lives.” What’s he saying? Is community just about what it provides for us?

Q: Luke chronicles both Jesus sending out the 12 disciples (Luke 9:1-9), and then a chapter later, tells the story of Jesus sending out the 72 disciples (Luke 10:1-17).



Read Luke 10:1-17 (encourage folks to use their Bibles).

Take turns reading out loud from Luke 10:1-17. Once you've read through the passage, discuss it together. This is a great opportunity to use your whiteboard and build some lists.

Q: What did Jesus tell them to do?

Q: What cautions does Jesus give?

Q: What's the outcome?

Q: From the text and Seth's teaching, why did he send them out together?

Q: In what ways can we practically apply this today?

Reserve time at the end to do two things:

1. Discuss how your Group can support each other in the next few months. The CDC is saying the next few months are going to be really challenging. How can we stay in community? What does our Group want to do to support each other? Take a few minutes to discuss how to help and support one another. Be creative and specific. Set some action items.

2. Break into groups of guys and gals and pray for one another. This is a challenging season and a great opportunity to create room for folks to share what they're walking through and pray for each other.
